United Protestant Church in Leuven

The United Protestant Church in Leuven is part of the United Protestant Church in Belgium (VPKB). The term “united” points to the merging of various currents within the Protestant churches in Belgium.

In our Sunday morning service (consisting of prayer, singing, Bible reading, explanation and commentary), inspired by the message of Jesus of Nazareth, we reflect on, and orient ourselves towards, our biblical faith. We orient ourselves on what Jesus taught and showed: that our existence is borne by the love of God and that, in spite of all brokenness, it has a deep meaning.

Children and young people also get the time to be creative with biblical stories in their own playful way and in their own space.

Following the service, there is always the opportunity to meet and talk over coffee.

During the week, we organise reading and



conversation circles where everyone, whether churchgoing/believing or not, is welcome and where, in a contemporary way, critical thinking and conversation about the Bible, faith and society takes place.

We want to be an open and hospitable church-in-the-city, paying attention to the needs and developments in society, in solidarity with young and old, regardless of origin, nationality or culture. We do volunteer work in residential care centres, visit and assist refugees, cooperate with the Protestant Social Centre (PSC) in Brussels and Antwerp, support the Leuven refugee centre (Wilsele), as well as the community centre ‘t Lampeke, Poverello and other “good causes”.

In this time of lockdown, we have, internally, a “phone service” for our community. People can call when they need help, whether at home, when shopping, or simply for a chat...

Peace Church Sint-Michiel

In the Sint-Michielskerk (St. Michael's Church), Dutch-speaking and Spanish-speaking worship services are held for the faithful.

A significant Spanish-speaking community in Leuven (mainly from South America) has found its 'home' here.

Partly because of the new and impressive Contius organ, and partly owing to the special acoustics of the church, the Sint-Michielskerk is often chosen as a partner in many activities and projects that combine music with religious experience: artists' masses, peace chancel, charity concerts.

In its parish work, the Sint-Michiel Parish has always maintained a strong belief in the power of peace that brings people together: by being a home for many communities and connecting them with each other, through international attention for peace and the support of various projects, by opening the church for peace initiatives of other groups, and by weaving peace care and solidarity into the liturgies and spirituality.

The word 'peace' needs to be understood in its vast plurality: personal peace, peace in the family, world peace ...

The Sint-Michielskerk in Leuven wishes to be an open house, where Peace is given every opportunity and where a broad community finds a home to work on Peace.
